## **DIRECTOR'S NOTES...**

Chicago is a big, flashy musical that uses literal performance to comment on the very serious topic of performative justice. In the world of the play, characters who are selfish, conniving, and amoral routinely come out on top by giving performances: performances of innocence, performances of remorse, and of course, distracting song-and-dance



routines. Nor is it a coincidence that the styles of performance they employ are classic Americana: vaudeville, ventriloquism, stage magic, burlesque. All of this performativity comments on the relative disregard for truth inherent in the notoriously corrupt criminal justice system of prohibition-era Chicago—and by extension, the American criminal justice system as a whole.

I wish that Chicago could stand alone as a simple period piece on the mob-run courts of the 1920s, but unfortunately, its relevance continues well into the present. Our current criminal justice system disproportionately arrests, convicts, and incarcerates Black Americans, acquits the cops who murder them extrajudicially, denies appeal to inmates proved to be innocent after the fact of their initial trial, and—since the suspension of habeas corpus by the Patriot Act of 2006—may hold and torture people indefinitely without a trial at all. In America today, there are concentration camps where legal migrants seeking refugee status in the U.S. are held in isolation from their families for staggering lengths of time while they await the chance to perform their worthiness for a judge. All of these are corrupt practices that base decisions on the appearance of things rather than the truth.

Our production of Chicago, flashy and distracting as it is, aims to draw attention to the human cost of performative justice by highlighting moments of reality that break through the big floor shows put on by the main characters. As you watch our show this evening, pay attention to the minor characters: the unseen, the unheard, the innocent, the victims. Their stories are just as important—perhaps moreso.

#### DRAMATURG'S NOTES...

With the passing of the Volstead Act came a steady increase in homicides in the United States. Unsurprisingly, the two real-life women who were the basis of Roxy Hart and Velma Kelly were intoxicated when they shot and killed their partners. Maurine Dallas Watkins, Chicago's playwright, based the story off of the trials she covered in 1924 as a reporter for the Chicago Tribune. Her proximity to the women gave her clear insight into their guilt— despite them being acquitted, Watkins personally believed both women were guilty.

Beulah Sheriff Annan, the basis of Roxie Hart, was 24 when she was arrested for the murder of Harry Kalstedt, her lover. According to her initial story, Beulah and Kalstedt had been drinking when an argument started. They both reached for Kalstedt's gun. Beulah reached it first. She played a foxtrot record, for four hours while watching Kalst~ edt die, before calling her husband Albert and claiming she had shot a man who tried to sleep with her. Beulah's story changed four times over the few months she was in jail. Prosecutors surmised that Kalst~ edt likely was going to leave Beulah, who shot him in a jealous rage.

Velma Kelly was based on Belva Gaertner, a three-time divorced cabaret singer. In 1924, Gaertner shot and killed her lover, Walter Law. He was found the next day in her car next to a bottle of gin and a gun. Police found Gaertner in her apartment, hungover and covered in bloody clothes, claiming she did not remember what had transpired. One of Law's co-workers testified that Gaertner was a possessive lover who had threatened Law with a knife when he tried to leave her, and Law had believed she would kill him one day. Gaertner's defense for the trial was that Law commit~ ted suicide. She was acquitted three months after the trial began.

Watkins' use of real people did not stop at the two women: Mary Sunshine was written as a satire of Watkins' rival reporters, most of whom believed the women to be innocent of their crimes. Billy Flynn is a combination of the two defense attorneys who represented Beulah Sheriff Annan and Belva Gaertner. Amos Hart is based on the real-life Albert Annan, who spent all of his monev attempting to free his wife from jail; Beulah's first act upon release was to publicly announce that she was leaving her husband.
